

# TOMAS 2.0

Vocational Training to Facilitate the Integration of Migrants in the Agri-Food Sector

## Project Overview

TOMAS 2.0 builds on the success of the first TOMAS project, continuing to support the **social and professional inclusion of migrants** in the agri-food sector. The project develops and delivers innovative, accessible, and digital vocational training (VET) to help migrants improve their skills, understand their rights, and integrate into the European labour market and society.

## Objectives

- Promote social inclusion and equal opportunities for migrants.
- Strengthen employability and integration in the agri-food sector.
- Provide accessible, learner-friendly e-learning VET courses, including AI-based support.
- Raise awareness of EU labour rights, values, and culture.
- Build strategic partnerships among VET providers, trade unions, NGOs, and stakeholders.

## Target Groups

- Migrants and mobile workers in the agri-food sector, especially those at risk of exclusion.
- VET trainers and educators seeking inclusive and modern teaching tools.
- Trade unions, NGOs, and community organisations supporting migrants' rights.
- Policymakers and employers in the agri-food sector aiming to promote fair and inclusive labour practices.



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## How Do We Achieve It

- Develop and optimise an interactive online VET course, with modules on workplace safety, labour rights, and integration.
- Deploy the training across 7 partner countries through local events and online delivery.
- Use AI-based tools to guide learners and support participation.
- Engage partners and associated NGOs to reach more migrants, especially those at risk of exclusion.
- Disseminate results through national and European awareness campaigns.

## Outcomes

- A modernised, multilingual, accessible VET course for migrants.
- Stronger integration and employability skills for migrant workers.
- Increased awareness among policymakers, educators, and employers about inclusive VET opportunities.
- Networking and cooperation between key stakeholders in the agri-food sector.
- Contribution to a more inclusive and democratic European society.
